

Class of 2024 National Fellows Program Application Instructions

We ask that you read the full instructions before you begin your application.

How to Apply:

To be considered for the 2024 Fellows Class, which runs from September 2023 to August 2024, you must submit your application by **February 10, 2023, at 11:59 pm EST**. *Please note that this is an update from the February 1, 2023 application deadline.*

Before applying, you will be prompted to create a SurveyMonkey Apply account (please look for an email from "fellowships@newamerica.org" in your inbox). If you applied to the program last year (Class of 2023) or have used SurveyMonkey Apply elsewhere, you will already have an account and can use the same login details to access this year's application.

Application Checklist:

- 1-3 sentence project description
- Statement of interest (2,000-word limit)
- Plan of approach (500-word limit)
- Policy implications (500-word limit)
- Resume (not to exceed five pages)
- Cover page for written work samples only; a Word template can be [downloaded here](#). The cover page should include your full name and the following information about each sample as follows:

 - Description of the piece (1-3 sentence summary):
- Up to three (3) written and/or non-written work samples
- Two (2) reference letter requests submitted directly from the application portal
 - Note: Reference letters are due by **February 10, 2023, at 11:59 pm EST** (*updated from February 6, 2023*)

Components of Your Application:

After you begin your application, you will be prompted to enter basic contact and background information. You will then be asked to complete the eight central components of your application:

1. **A 1-3 sentence description of your New America Fellowship project.**
2. **Statement of Interest:**

The core of the application in which you explain your proposal for the fellowship—your line of inquiry, how you plan to develop it, why you feel this project will enrich an important public debate, and how you could contribute to and benefit from a fellowship from New America.

This statement **should not exceed 2,000 words.**

3. **Plan of Approach:**

Your plan of approach should explain how the proposed project will be executed during the fellowship, including your plan for dissemination once the project is complete. To be clear, projects can be completed outside the fellowship year, but the plan of approach for the year should be articulated in this section.

This statement **should not exceed 500 words.**

4. **Policy Implications:**

A brief statement that explains the policy implications of your stated project. Avoid duplicating portions of your statement of interest above by focusing on the impact you hope your project will have.

If your project is primarily journalistic, analytic, or historical, how do you believe its lessons might change policy going forward? If your project is built around a policy proposal, how do you anticipate shepherding it from an idea to an implemented reality? If your project overlaps with policy programs at New America, use this statement to discuss that area of overlap: How would your project add to New America's existing policy work in your area?

This statement **should not exceed 500 words.**

5. **Resume:**

Your professional resume or biography.

Not to exceed five (5) pages.

6. **Work Samples Cover Page (for written samples only):**

Please prepare a cover page for all of your written work samples.

The cover page should include your full name and the following information about each written work sample.

- Description of the piece (1-3 sentence summary):

A cover page is not required for non-written work samples, as you will be asked to enter information about your video or audio samples in the form itself.

7. **Written and/or Non-written Work Samples:**

(please read these instructions carefully before preparing your work samples)

Instructions for submitting **written** work samples **only**:

- You can choose to submit a total of **up to three (3) work samples (combined into one PDF file packet)**.
- Your writing samples packet should **not exceed 40 pages** (41 with the cover page).

Instructions for submitting **non-written** work samples **only**:

- Based on the project you are proposing, we will accept **up to three (3) non-written work samples** (film and/or audio clips).
- Due to limited upload capacity, we ask that you submit a link for each work sample (with or without a password).
- **All video and/or audio clips must be your original work, aiming to convey a sense of your capabilities and aesthetic.** For instance, **TED talks or media interviews will not count** as an original non-written work sample and should not be submitted as a work sample in support of your application.
- Non-written work samples (film and/or audio clips) **should not exceed a half-hour of total video or audio content.**
- **A cover page is not required for non-written work samples**, as you will be asked to enter information about your video or audio samples in the form.

Instructions for submitting a **combination** of written & non-written work samples:

- You may share one or two (1 or 2) written work samples in combination with one or two (1 or 2) video/audio work samples that may be relevant to your candidacy for the Fellowship. **You may not share more than three (3) work samples.**

8. **Two Reference Letters:**

You will be asked to submit two (2) reference letter requests to your recommender through the application portal. References will be asked to create a SurveyMonkey Apply account and can upload their letter directly in the portal. If your reference has trouble uploading a PDF version of their letter, please ask that they email their letter (PDF) to FellowsProgram@newamerica.org, and we will upload it to your application on their behalf.

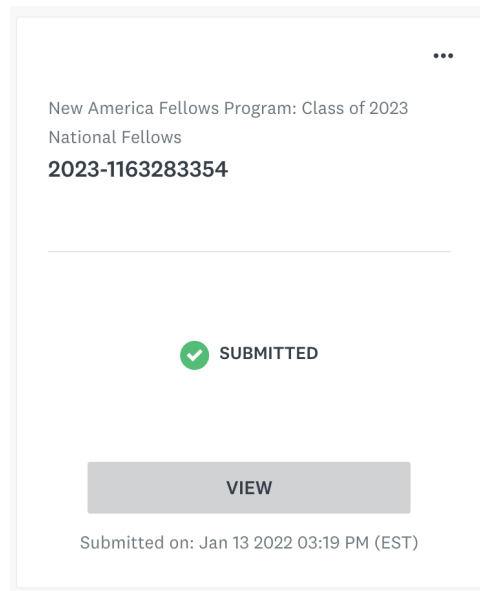
The deadline to receive reference letters is **February 10, 2023, at 11:59 pm EST**. ***Please note that this is an update from the February 6, 2023 application deadline.***

Applications missing reference letters will be considered incomplete.

Application Submission Notification:

When you finish the required sections and submit your application, you will be taken to a confirmation page stating that you have successfully submitted your materials. You will also receive a similar confirmation email at your provided email address. **Please note that all submissions are final, and you will not be given permission to edit your application once submitted.**

Your application submission status will show “SUBMITTED” per the example image below:
